### A. A. A. Contest Board Chairman Sends National Circuit Schedule to Local Promoter.

## INDIANAPOLIS LANDS BEST

### Receives Most Favorable Days on Entire Calendar, Including Labor Day Meet.

For the first time the list of dates for the 1910 A. A. A. national racing circuit has been announced. This list was sent to W. H. Wellman of this city by S. M. Butler of New York, who is chairman of the A. A. A. contest board.

This list is not quite complete, but will for the most part remain as now drafted. Mr. Wellman will have the promoting power in nine cities this summer, according to the sanctioning right given him recently by the three A's.

St. Louis was originally on Mr. Wellman's circuit, but, because of failure to provide a track at that city, he has canceled his sanctions there.

**Local Cars Did Well.**  
The car that makes the highest number of points in this circuit this season will be crowned the winner of the land. Indianapolis has more racing cars ready and being prepared for the season's speed battles than any other city, and, judging from the past records made by the local machines, it is safe to predict that some Hoosier creation stands a good chance of being "the" car of all.

In case of races at two different tracks on the same date, only one will be sanctioned by the A. A. A. For example, Dallas, Tex., has races booked for July 4. Indianapolis has the sanctioned date for that day. This means that the records made here will be recognized and that manufacturers will send their best pilots and cars here. The Dallas events will be purely local affairs, with cars entered by Dallas dealers, and the records, if any are made, will not be official.

**Plucks Every Plum.**  
One significant thing in connection with this list of dates is the fact that Indianapolis is given the Labor day date. This was the only plum that the local Speedway men did not pluck at the recent New York meeting. The matter at that time was set aside. According to this list it has been agreed to give this date to the local track, which means that Indianapolis has all of the best dates of the calendar.

Mr. Wellman's circuit now consists of Milwaukee, Detroit, Louisville, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Buffalo, Pittsburg, Baltimore and Washington. Mr. Wellman is now preparing to make a tour of these cities and confer with the automobile clubs in every one concerning the race meets that will be held this season.
