

ATLANTA BUILDS TRACK

VIES WITH LOCAL SPEEDWAY

BOUTHERNERS PREPARE BIG MOTOR
RACE COURSE THAT BIDS STRONG
TO SUPPLY SOME NEW SENSATIONAL RECORDS.

ATLANTA, Ga., Sept. 11.—With every detail being attended to with the utmost care and every part of the big force engaged on the task going like clock work, the completion of the big motor speedway fifteen days before the scheduled time now seems a certainty.

It has been decided to spend \$5,000

more than was at first intended in order to get the track finished ahead of time. By doing this the speedway will gain additional distinction. It has always been expected that such large undertakings as this would be behind time. It has been the rule almost in every instance. When a date is set for the opening of a great public enterprise the people generally smile and declare it will be in readiness
