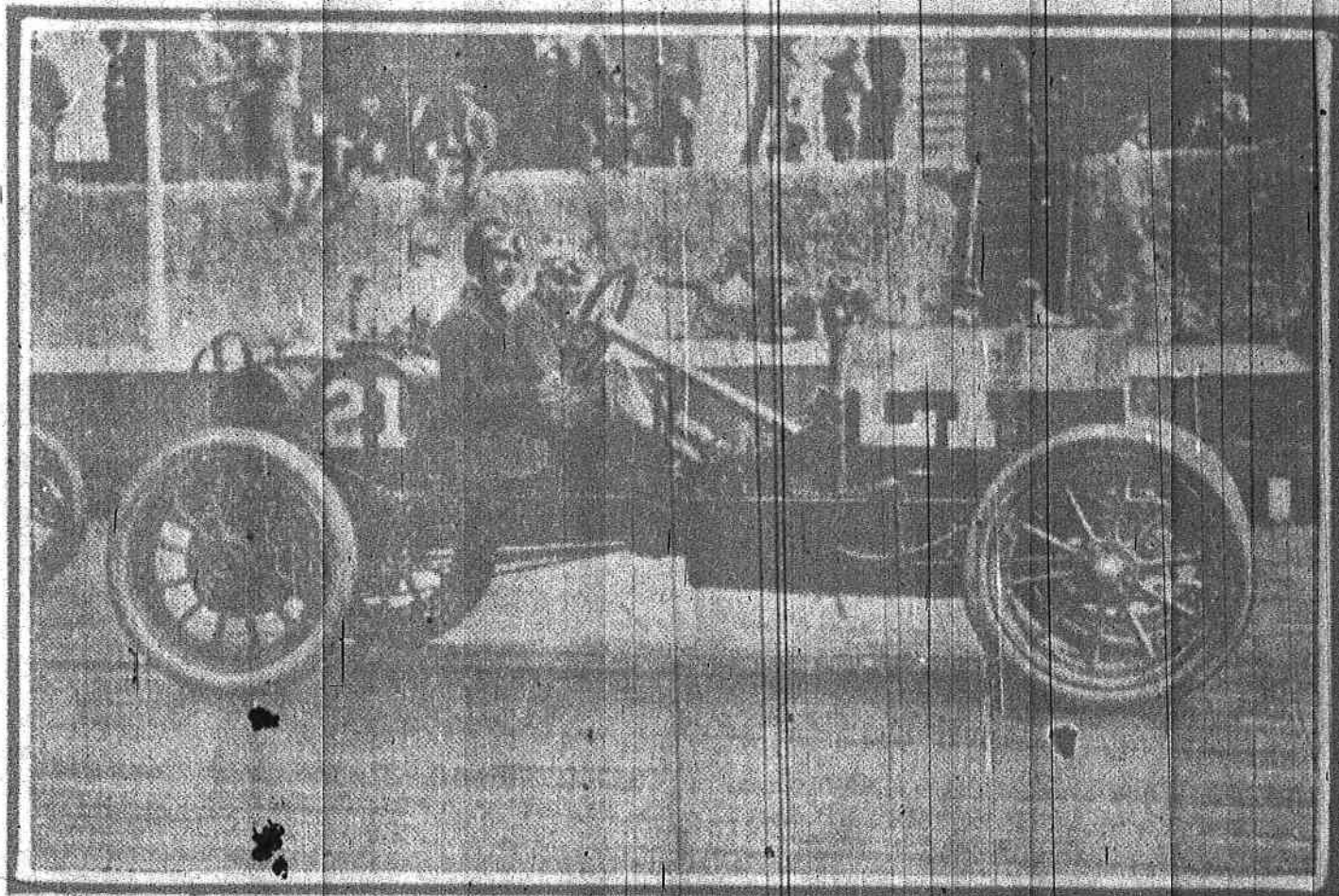


Indianapolis Racing Car Makes Good



Ray W. Harroun, in the No. 21 Marmon, winner of the 120-mile race for the Atlanta Automobile Association trophy at the Atlanta automobile speedway, November 11, made an average of 65 1/4 miles an hour. This race was sixty circuits of the two-mile track, and was open to stock chassis of 221 to 300 cubic inches. Harroun used the same Marmon car in

which he won the Wheatly Hills sweepstakes trophy in the Vanderbilt cup race on Long Island October 30. In this event he made one of the most beautiful races of the meet held at the mammoth Atlanta automobile motor dome, not stopping once after the start, although other competitors of the race were compelled to stop at times for minor troubles. In addition to the trophy, Harroun won \$500 in gold.

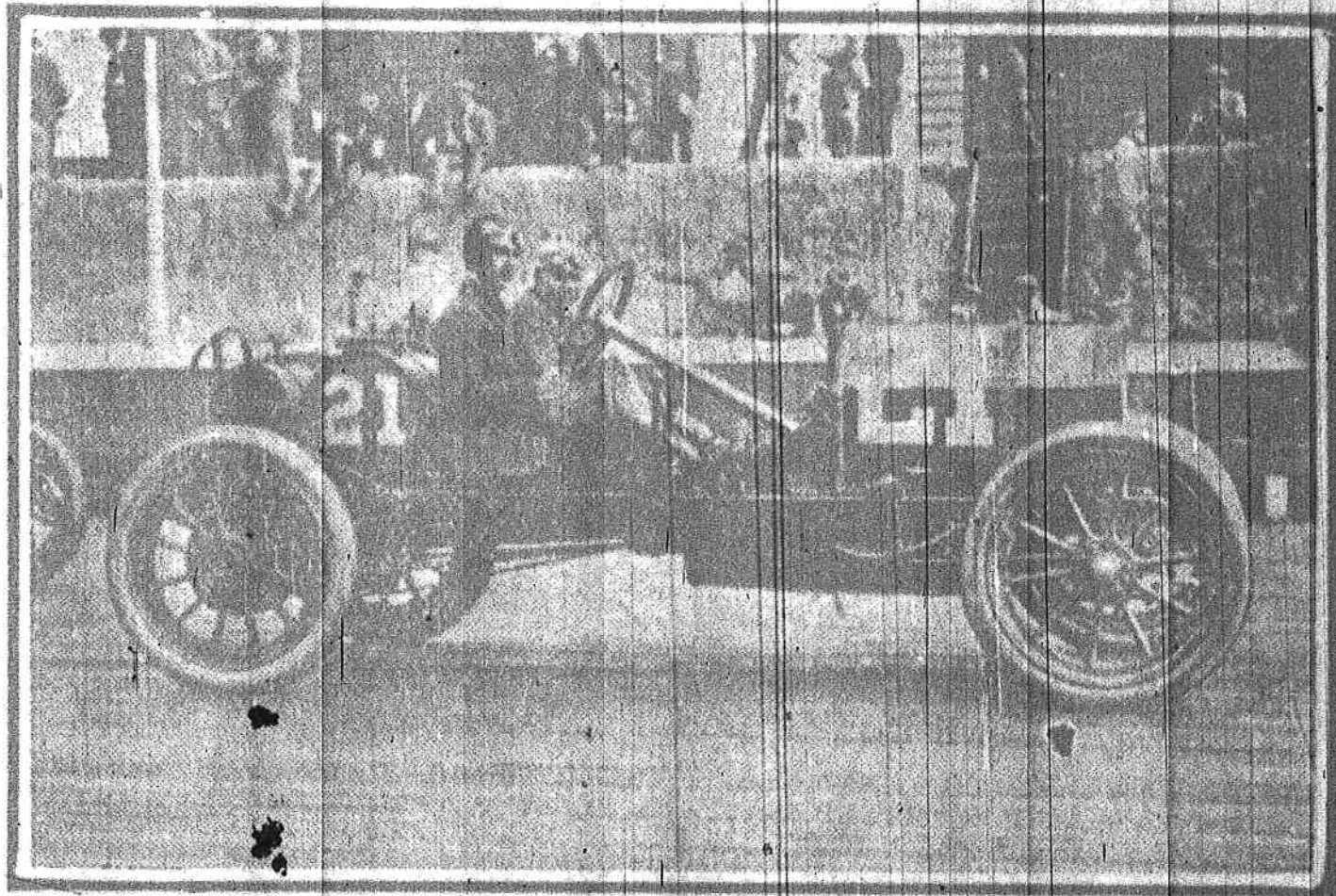
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
