Agency for De Tamble Cars.



Overland on Long Trip.

A trip of seven hundred miles through mud, sand and in hail and snow, from Toledo to New York, was made last week by George L. Riess in a little Overland runabout in less than forty hours' actual running time. Though this is remarkably fast time for a small car, it would have been cut several hours were it not for the fact that road and weather conditions were anything but what are desired for a trip of this kind and for unavoidable obstacles encountered en route. As it was, however, the car broke one record, that between Toledo and Cleveland, making the trip in 4 hours and 5 minutes, 20 minutes faster than it has ever before been made. The 127 miles between the two cities was made at an average of 19.29 miles an hour.

Gold Plated Studebaker.

Gold plated and finished in the most elaborate style in which an automobile was ever turned out of the factory, a Studebaker landaulet was recently shipped from South Bend to San Francisco, and is now on display there at the showrooms of the Studebaker Bros., the center of interest of the individual automobile show which that concern is conducting during Portola week.

An idea of the elegance of the landaulet may be obtained when it is briefly stated that all metal trimmings of the car are gold plated. This includes the two headlights, the side lights and the tail lamp, grease cups, hub caps, body handles, both inside and outside. The horn and tube are likewise plated, as are also the moldings on the running boards. The gear shift lever and the emergency brake lever are gold plated, as are the glass front, hood hinges, handles and catches.

Friction Between Friction Builders.

The recent assuming of the general sales agency for the Lambert friction-driven automobiles in a large territory of the United States, including Michigan, by J. E. McIntosh, of the McIntosh Auto Company, Detroit, resulted in his speedily becoming involved in legal difficulty.

The Cartercar Company, of Pontiac, Mich., makers of the friction-driven Cartercar, has commenced suit against J. E. McIntosh as general sales agent and the Buckeye Manufacturing Company, of Anderson, Ind., manufacturers of the Lambert car.

It seems that suit is brought for infringement of certain claims of the Carter patent No. 761146, dated May 31, 1904, by which the Cartercar people claim to be the first builders of successful friction-driven automobiles. Proceedings were begun in the United States circuit court at Detroit, October 19, through Parker & Burton, patent attorneys.
