INDIANAPOLIS DRIVER SMASHES ANOTHER MARK

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AITKEN CRASHES THROUGH SPACE WITH SPEED OF BULLET.

MARMON AND NATIONAL WIN

ATLANTA, November 12.—Crashing through space with the speed of a bullet, Johnny Aitken whirled his National "Forty" to another American track record on the two-mile motor speedway yesterday afternoon. In a furious, brain-racking drive of twenty miles, in every moment of which he was hard pressed from behind, the Indianapolis "daredevil" clocked a new mark of 16:42.76. This is 0:11.4 better than Oldfield's figure set at the Hoosier oval.

Ray Harroun, of Chicago, handling a Marmon, captured the 120-mile stock chassis race in a desperate struggle, going the route in 1:49:28.4. Joe Matson, in a Chalmers-Detroit, was six miles behind; Basie in a Renault third, and Louis Chevrolet in a Buick last. Fire igniting Chevrolet's car twice stopped the intrepid Swiss pilot.

Balked by mechanical trouble on his Fiat in the first two days of the meet, George Robertson yesterday succeeded in finishing two contests. He was forced to withdraw from the twenty-mile handicap at the end of the first mile, but returned and captured the ten-mile handicap in a bruising drive over Aitken and Harding, the latter in an Amperon, in 7:47.7. Detroit, was first in 4:05.5, with Knipper,
in a car of the same make, second. The
