

AUTOMOBILE ROW GAINS NEW BUSINESS BUILDING

G. M. WESTING CO. TO ESTABLISH MOTORCYCLE GARAGE.

MAY HANDLE AUTOMOBILES

Negotiations have been completed for the erection, in North Delaware street, of a modern two-story brick business block, the same to be leased and occupied by the G. M. Westing Company with an up-to-date motorcycle garage and showroom. A line of automobiles is also contemplated.

The new building will be directly opposite automobile row, and will be erected by William J. Baker, a pioneer hotel keeper at Indianapolis, on the site of his present residence. Work of razing the old building, which has been Mr. Baker's home for twenty-five years, will begin within a few days. It is planned to have the new building, which will be a two-story brick structure with basement, 30x120 feet in dimensions, ready for occupancy as soon after the first of the year as possible.

Speedway Trials Next Month.

E. A. Davies, director of contests for the Indianapolis motor speedway, who has withdrawn his resignation, has returned from Atlanta and corroborated the previous announcement made in that city to the effect that speed trials for the purpose of breaking all world's records will be held on the newly-brickled Indianapolis course on either May 11 or 12. Louis Straus and his 100-horse power Fiat with which he annihilated all records at Atlanta, participated in the Indianapolis events, along with many other famous drivers.

Owen Favored Technical Test.

Of the thirty-seven cars that started in the New York-Atlanta reliability run last week, twenty-six finished with perfect scores. Owing to the strenuous route followed, the showing is held to be unusually good, although had there been a technical examination with penalties for repairs and adjustments en route, the perfect cars list doubtless would have been cut down considerably.

Immediately after the committee had made its report showing the large number of perfect scores, R. M. Owen, who drove one of the new four-cylinder touring cars, held that there could be but one logical winner of such an event.

Owen suggested that each car having a perfect score, regardless of price or rated horse power, submit to a technical examination immediately after the cars were checked out at Atlanta, and that repairs or replacements made en route should be charged against the car.

However, it was not found possible to get all of the manufacturers to agree to such a test. Had it been made it would have been a splendid basis for comparison, as a wise motor car buyer wants to know not only what a car does in a road race, but what it can do in the
