Indianapolis and Indiana automobile and automobile accessory makers will form a large part of the 267 exhibitors, of which number 101 will show motorcars, that will take part in the tenth annual show of the National Association of Automobile Manufacturers, which will open in Chicago next Saturday afternoon. The display of cars and accessories will be spread over 89,000 square feet of space that is found in the Coliseum, Coliseum annex and the First Regiment armory.

This is not quite so large a show as the one that was held a year ago this time, but this is not because of lack of applicants for space, for there were more than 125 on the waiting list. But Manager Miles dislodged some of the exhibitors of sundries and gave their space to the car makers, and as the latter naturally required more room in a space than did the maker of sundries, the size of the show has been decreased a trifle.

But it is going to be a grand show, all the critics declare, and it is predicted that it will exceed New York not alone in the beauty of the decorations but also as a business-getter. It is true that so
