About \$3,500 has been raised by voluntary donations for a show fund to defray mutual expenses. The finest cup will be awarded the private owner who is credited with the most beautiful car in the floral parade during the show. Another cup for the same kind of a car will be awarded the dealer or manufacturer who produces the best decorated exhibit.

Another prize will be given the entrant, either private owner or trade man, who has the most unique car. This latter competition gives a wide field and plenty of room for motor lovers to use their imagination and let their decorative skill have full sway. The boosters are expecting to make this floral parade a record breaker.

Use Point System.

Two other prizes will be given as first and second to the winners of the events at the Speedway. Any one can enter these events, but no one will be entitled to a prize unless they enter at least six events. A system of points will be kept, and the driver with the most to his credit will receive the silver cup. Private owners and trade people are eligible to these events.

Entry blanks for the speedway events and the parade must be filled out before Monday, March 28.

POULTRY OBJECT OF P

New York Wants to Know Shipments of Fowl.

NEW YORK, March 1.—William Garven, the public prosecutor of Essex County, New Jersey, is trying to get a list of the books of the six big packing companies recently indicted with their officers and directors, a grand jury in New York today began investigation of the poultry trade in the greater city. The grand jury who indicted eight directors of the Consolidated Milk Exchange received charge of this new inquiry and the assumption is that it is preliminary to a general investigation of the poultry business in New York.

The investigation started by the grand jury today, however, has to do with "poultry" rather than storage for poultry. Investigations have been made that the New York Live Poultry Commission Merchants' Protective Association have been bringing live poultry into the city and holding it for a rise in the market.
