LONG MOTORCYCLE RACE.

Erwin G. Baker and John Slink In 100 Mile Event at Noblesville.

John Slink and Erwin G. Baker, the two
 most prominent motorcycle racers in In-
 diana, both members of the Indiana Mo-
 torcycle Club, have arranged a one-
 hundred-mile race at Noblesville to mor-
 row. There has been a great deal of
 rivalry between Baker and Slink. They
 have met in a number of short races
 through Indiana and Ohio, with victory
 always on Baker's side. Slink thinks he
 can win in a long race. One-hundred-mile
 motorcycle races are a novelty in this
 section of the country, though they are
 common in the east. The race will be on
 a flat dirt track, and though the time
 made will not be anywhere near so fast
 as would be possible on a banked track,
 the riders expect to approach the record
 for half-mile flat tracks, which is about a
 mile in 1:15.
