

MESSAGES FROM THE BALLOONS.

ONLY THE OHIO OF THE NINE RACERS HAS LANDED, NASHVILLE, IN BROWN COUNTY, INDIANA, BEING THE SCENE

The Ohio is the only balloon that has been forced to seek the earth. It landed at 6:20 at Nashville, Ind., in a newly plowed field. Dr. H. W. Thompson, pilot, instantly telephoned The Star and reported a pleasant trip.

The reason for dropping was the lack of sufficient ballast. He was entered in the handicap race and was not expected to travel even as long as he did.

The early advent of darkness after the balloonists had gotten well on their way, prevented the receiving of many notes. It is a difficult matter to find notes dropped from a balloon subject to the will of the winds after dark.

The messages received indicate a divergence of directions. The latest report was from Vincennes, Ind., saying that an unrecognized vessel sailed over that city at 9:30 o'clock directed toward the West.

Messages from Edinburg and other small towns indicate both the direction of the flyers and the uniform curiosity that is being manifested by persons everywhere.

Carl Fisher and Capt. G. L. Bumbaugh of Indianapolis were heard from at Nineveh, Ind., at 7:15 o'clock. They reported that all was well and that they were carrying on a conversation with Honeywell and Lambert, who had invited them over to supper. They were 800 feet apart.

The special messages received last night from the aeronauts directed to The Star follow:

NASHVILLE, Ind., June 5.—(To The Indianapolis Star)—The Ohio landed one mile west of here tonight at 6:20 o'clock. The lack of ballast was the cause for this early descent of the first starter in the handicap race at Indianapolis this afternoon.

We had a pleasant, uneventful trip, but regret we were compelled to drop so soon.

We landed in a newly plowed Brown County field. Our balloon is being rolled ready to ship home to Salem, O.

SEYMOUR, Ind., June 5.—(To The Indianapolis Star)—Several Indianapolis balloons were seen flying slightly west of here at 10 o'clock tonight. They dropped messages.

VINCENNES, Ind., June 5.—A large balloon was sighted above this city at 9:30 o'clock tonight. Several automobile parties followed it south for fifteen miles or more. The name of the bag could not be ascertained as the men were too high to carry on conversation. Flashes from electric search lights were the only signs received from the flyers. First a red, next a green and then a white light would appear.
