

ROBERTSON IN SIMPLEX WINS 24-HOUR RACE

Drives 1,001 Miles, With Rainier Second
and Palmer-Singer Close
Third.

BRIGHTON BEACH, N. Y., July 31.—Robertson, driving the Simplex car, won the twenty-four-hour automobile race here tonight. The Rainier was second and the Palmer-Singer third. Robertson's distance was 1,001 miles.

The race was resumed promptly at 8:05. The Simplex got off in the lead, followed by the Palmer-Singer, the Stearns and the Rainier. The Acme and Lozier remained in the paddock for repairs. The Lozier started later, but the Acme retired from the race because of a broken frame, leaving five cars competing. The Lozier came on the track only a few minutes before the expiration of the twenty-first hour, covering only five miles in the time. This gave the Stearns fourth place.

The cars finished as follows:
Simplex, driven by G. H. Robertson, 1,001 miles.
Rainier, driven by I. A. Diebrow, 1,041 miles.

Palmer-Singer, driven by Frank Lescault, 988 miles.
Stearns, driven by Laurent Grosse, 910 miles.

Lozier, driven by R. Mulford, 888 miles.
The contest was open to all stock cars selling at \$2,500 or over, and to the winner goes \$1,000; second money is \$500; third, \$300, and fourth, \$200.

The score at 9:05, the end of the twenty-third hour, was:

Simplex, 1,052 miles.
Rainier, 1,001 miles.
Palmer-Singer, 930 miles.
Stearns, 876 miles.
Lozier, 846 miles.

BURMAN WINS IN BUICK.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., July 31.—The Glidden tourists were entertained today with automobile races at Elmridge Park. No records were made, as heavy rains made the track slow.

The feature event, a 100-mile endurance race for gasoline stock cars, was won by Robert Burman in a Buick in 1:54:08.

The fastest mile was made by Burman in fifty-eight seconds. Burman drove five miles against time, covering the distance in 5:03.
