NOTED DRIVERS TO COMPETE

NEW YORK, August 24.—On the heels
of the tragedies which christened the
new motor speedway at Indianapolis
last week with blood will come another
season of automobile racing on metropol-
itan tracks. On Friday and Saturday of
this week the Brighton Beach track will
see another twenty-four-hour race and
several shorter contests. George Robert-
son, the winner of the twenty-four-hour
race at Brighton earlier in the season,
will drive again. Other drivers will be
Ralph De Palma, Charles Basle, Ralph
Mufford and Harry Cobe. The Brighton
track has been improved and is now be-
lieved to be the fastest mile course in
the country. In addition to this "twice-
around-the-clock" contest speed enthu-
siasts will have a chance on Labor day
to see a three-hundred-mile race on the
old track at Guttenburg, N. J.
