NEW YORK, May 13.—Predictions of smashed records were made today while the final tryouts for the 24-hour motor race that starts tonight at 8 o'clock at the Brighton Beach Motordrome were made. More than \$100,000 has been laid out by manufacturers preparing for the contest.

Some of the best-known drivers in the country are in the list of entrants, and the track is declared to be in unusually fast condition. Special hospital arrangements have been made. Much is expected of Strang and Anderson, in a Marion, and of Endicott and Edmonds, in a Cole. Both of these are Indianapolis cars.

The record for 24 hours is now held by a Losier car, 1,196 miles, but expectations are that a new figure well above 1,200 miles will be established.

Special attention has been given to the lighting of the track, every foot of the way being as bright as possible.

Several of the men were out early in the day for trial spins. They started at dawn, and when they finished went to sleep in preparation for tonight's grind.

CONRAD WILL TRY TO SMASH STATE RECORDS

Much Expected of Earlham Ath-
lete in Dual Track Meet With
De Pauw University Team.

RICHMOND, Ind., May 13.—Capt. Conrad of the Earlham college track team will try for three Earlham records in the dual field meet with DePauw on Reid field tomorrow. The meet promise to be one of the hardest contested events between the two institutions.

Conrad will be entered in five or six events and will try for a new record in the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes and the high jump. In his practice this season he has broken all three of the records and if the field is not too wet, after the recent rain, he will probably capture three state records.
