COEY BUYS AEROPLANE HERE.

Contracts With Capt. Bumbaugh for "Wings" and Big Balloon.

Charles E. Coey of Chicago was in this city yesterday and made a contract with Capt. G. L. Bumbaugh for a balloon and an aeroplane. Mr. Coey has a record as an aeronaut of the balloon school and aspires to learn to use man-made wings. After considering several different models that are already being offered for sale this Chicago millionaire decided that the Indianapolis-made kind will best suit his purposes.

The balloon will be the regulation racing size, that of 22,000 cubic feet capacity. He intends to use it in the national balloon races this summer.

He told Capt. Bumbaugh that he wants his aeroplane done by the first real spring weather, as he intends making Indianapolis his flying headquarters, learning how to use the aeroplane under the captain's directions at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.
