### Coey Will Arrive Today.

A telegram from Charles A. Coey was received last night by Capt. G. L. Brumbaugh saying that he would arrive in this city this morning. He is anxious to get on the grounds, from whence the national balloon race will start June 5. He has expressed intentions of making a few test ascensions from the "speedway" grounds at once. He will use the big "Chicago" cloud flyer in the race.

The pilots and their aids will also carry full waterproof outfits, as all the great golden balls that will start on their space-conquering journey will be in the air at night and many of them several nights.

"Night flight is unusually dangerous," said G. L. Brumbaugh, the expert instructor of the Indiana Aero Club. "It requires constant attention to your instruments, as a mist cloud drifting across your course will chill the gas of your great gauzy envelope and you are liable to start on a descent trip that will prove disastrous; though, from a pleasure point of view, night flight is very fascinating.

### Shoots at Aeronaut.

"The flashing of the pocket electric lamp causes the great golden ball to look like a glowworm in the sky. And this soaring near the earth is not without danger. I particularly remember a few years ago, while on a night flight, we had become a little careless, and, desiring to save ballast, we were soaring quite close to the ground. It was just before daylight.

"We passed close to a farmhouse, and the farmer, thinking us some great bird, rushed into the house and grabbed his gun and fired several shots from a repeating rifle at us.

"One of the shots penetrated the bag, passing right over the basket. Of course, it would take a long time to let the gas out through a rifle hole, but it would have been more serious had he hit the basket, as he might have killed one of us.
