

## Fly From Indianapolis to Franklin.



#### THE START.

Using an immense new balloon in its test trip W. G. Wall of the National Motor Vehicle Company, M. E. Haywood of the Willis-Haywood-Holcomb Automobile Company and G. L. Bumbaugh, an aeronaut of Springfield, Ill., who owned the "airship." made a successful flight from Indianapolis to a point near Franklin, Ind., yesterday afternoon.

The men ascended at Twenty-first street and Northwestern avenue with great ease. They passed over the large smoke stack at the gas works and in their flight over Indianapolis soared directly above the Soldiers' and Sailors' Monu-

ment. About ten miles south of the city the balloon reached it highest point—4,000 feet from the earth's surface. The men started on the trip at 2:30 p. m. and landed in an open field near Franklin at 4:45 p. m. While in the aerial flight they enjoyed a pleasant lunch. The weather was not cold excepting when the balloon was highest in its flight. Had the breezes been brisk the men would have taken a longer journey. When the balloon landed near Franklin Will Strielle of the National Motor Car Vehicle Company and Frank Willis of the Willis-Haywood-Holcomb Automobile Company were near by in machines to bring the men back to Indianapolis.
