BALLOON CHICAGO TO REMAIN UP FIVE DAYS

THAT IS EXPECTATION OF DAYTON AERONAUTS.

CAPTAIN BUMBAUGH PILOT

DAYTON, O., June 23.—C. A. Coey's balloon, Chicago, which has figured in several notable flights, including that at Indianapolis two weeks ago, will be brought to Dayton shortly to accommodate a party of six, who plan remaining in the air for several days and nights. The balloon will be in charge of Captain G. L. Bumbaugh, who came here from Indianapolis today to complete arrangements. This balloon has a capacity of 112,000 cubic feet of gas and is expected to stay in the air five days. Provisions for that length of time will be taken by the party, which includes Captain Bernard Wender, F. C. Carley, Dr. P. M. Crume and Luzerne Custer. The remaining members of the party have not been chosen, but the balloonist is deluged with applications. Dayton has gone wild over aerial navigation, and a number of balloons will be bought by members of the Dayton Aero Club.

The International Aeroplane Club, formed to commemorate the arrival home of Wilbur and Orville Wright, is also preparing for the first American flight of the aeroplanists, outside of Ft. Myer, on the occasion of the dedication of the new Memorial building this summer.

Leo Stevens and his associates, including Ralph De Voe, John S. McIntire, Harry Ferneding and Carroll Sprigg, returned from Lima, O., yesterday, having gone there from Findlay after the balloon All America, landed in that neighborhood. The balloon was brought to the city by train, and will be used in making other flights from this city.
