make a proper showing unless we should thoroughly prepare for it; hire experienced drivers, build racing cars and go after the prizes in a whole-hearted manner, making thorough preparation for the work to be done; but, as before stated, we do not be-lieve that the advertising secured is commensurate with the amount of expense and time necessary to look after these affairs.
