EVERY BRANCH CLAIMS LIVES

Cycling, Automobiling, Walking, Running, Baseball and All Other Demand Sacrifices.


Robert Burman, the clever Westerner who drove the Jackson car for nineteen out of the twenty-four hours at Morris Park last year, says, referring to the mishap at Baltimore May 29, where Cedrino met his death: "Some men believe track racing the safest; another styles road racing safer; another looks upon beach racing as the only form of sport, and others believe hill climbing alone nonhazardous. In every form of the sport, including touring, lives are sacrificed, and it is not evident which is safest. "We shall have road, track, beach, hill and other forms of racing, and also touring, and without a doubt men will con-

tinue to pass to the hereafter, all in their proper time, in the future, as in the past. "When airship contests come in vogue, we shall continue to see contests in which lives will be lost. In the days of the cycle men lost their lives. In cycling the howl went up against every form of the sport at the time of an accident, but every accident slipped from mind, as did also the probable chances of death, when another contest came around.

"It is so in automobiling, and it will be so in airship sport. It is so in every form of sport and in life itself, for men are killed walking, rufning, street car riding and in carriages, but the rest go on living and progressing just the same."
