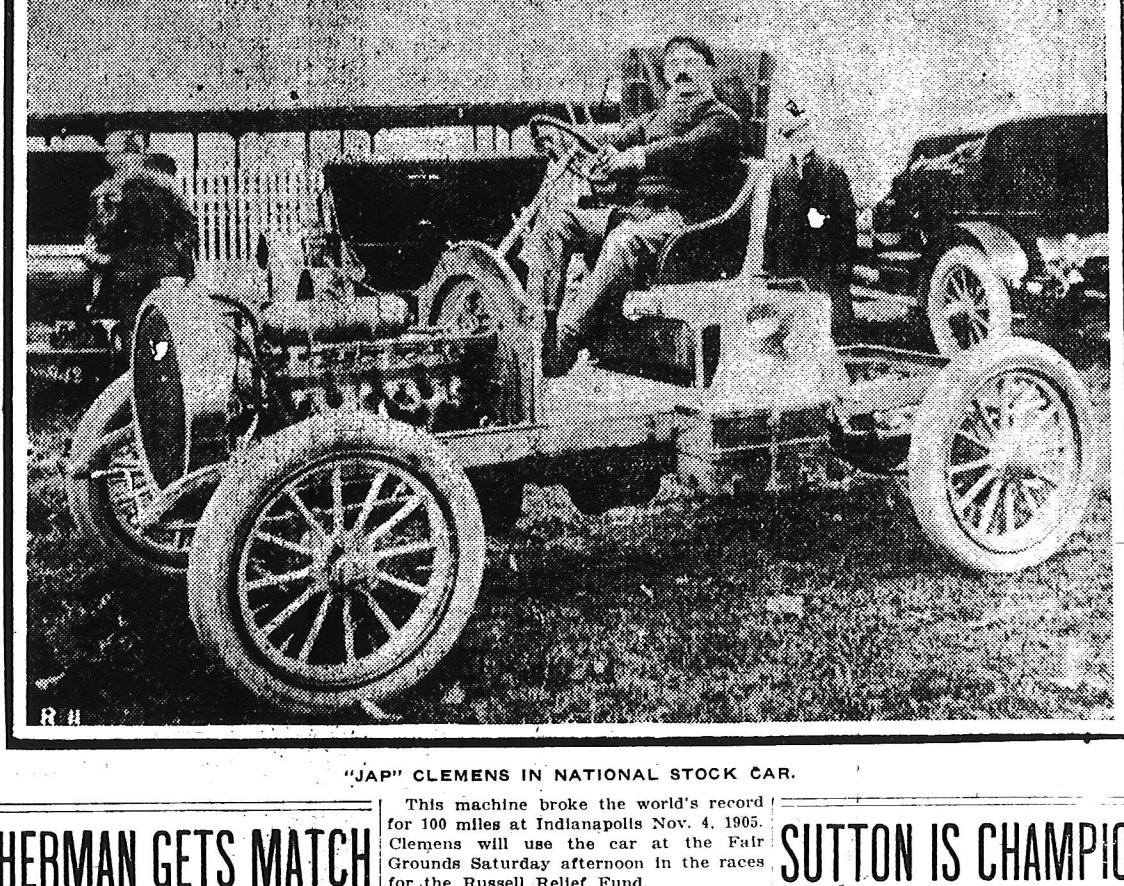


Will Race Saturday for Russell Relief Fund

HERMAN GETS MATCH

TO FIGHT FOR \$20,000 PURSE

Chicago Lightweight Will Meet Either Gans, Nelson, Britt or Young Corbett.

CHICAGO, Oct. 18.—Kid Herman, the Chicago lightweight who has been trying to get a match with Battling Nelson, has been assured a fight at Virginia City, Nev., with either Nelson, Gans, Britt or Young Corbett. This offer has been accepted and Billy Nolan, Nelson's manager is now being communicated with. He will likely accept.

The offer came to Nate Lewis, manager of Herman, from Mike Brennan, a former Chicago bookmaker, who is interested in gold mines in Nevada and who has organized a club to pull off a big fight during the next sixty days. Brennan has made three offers to Lewis—a purse of \$20,000 for a match with Nelson, a purse of \$20,000 for a fight with Britt, a purse of \$20,000 for a bout with Gans and an offer of \$8,000 for a match with either McGovern or Young Corbett.

Each fighter is offered \$500 for expenses. The offers were accepted by Lewis at once with the exception of the \$8,000 purse for a match with either McGovern or Young Corbett. Lewis insists that he will not fight for a purse of that size as Herman is too big a drawing card to meet any of the big fellows for less than \$15,000.

GOOD DAY FOR FAVORITES

Hot Toddy Set Fast Pace in Ramapo Handicap, but Is Beaten in the Stretch by a Favorite.

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—Hot Toddy was the pace-maker to the stretch in the Ramapo Handicap today, where Running Water, the favorite, went to the front and won easily. Running Water was the third winning favorite of the day.

Welbourne was a well backed good thing in the opening dash and it went through. Welbourne opened at 8 to 1 and was backed down to a favorite's position. John Lyle, the opening favorite, was crowded all through the stretch by True Wind and the latter was disqualified.

T. S. Martin was the favorite in the Harbor Hill Cup race. He made all the running and won easily.

Higginbotham in the third race ran five furlongs in :58 2-6, beating the record by three-quarters of a second.

In the sixth race Glenham made all the running and won easily by two lengths from Work and Play, which beat Sandy Creeker two lengths for the place.

SUTTON IS CHAMPION

BEATS SLOSSON AT 18.2 GAME

Billiard Contest for Title Is Played at Madison Square Garden, New York.

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—George Sutton of Chicago is now the acknowledged world's champion at 18.2 balk billiards. In a match game for this title he defeated George Slosson of this city at Madison Square Garden Concert Hall tonight by a score of 500 to 375.

In the tournament held here last April Sutton made the world's record run of 234, which Hoppe later beat at Chicago, and an average of 100. Sutton tonight showed some of the most brilliant billiards ever seen in this city. His best run was 202 in the tenth inning. Score:
