### Discovers Course Is Short.

A discovery was made yesterday by General Executive Trego that the Crown-point auto course is nine-tenths of a mile shorter than had been estimated. When the circuit was first selected it was roughly estimated that it was twenty-four and one-half miles in length, but an odometer yesterday showed it to be only 23.6 miles. This, therefore, will cut down the distance of the Cobe cup race from 410 miles to 402, and the light car event from 245 to 236 miles. After finishing his trip, Trego declared the 23.6 miles to be official.

Col. Sanborn of the First Regiment of the Illinois national guard is making active preparations to guard the course with his citizen soldiery. This will be the first time on record where the militia of one state has been permitted to go into another commonwealth for the purpose of patrolling a road race course.

The Illinois soldiers are mostly veterans of the late Spanish war.

An allotment of single cylinder Cadillac cars was received yesterday by the local agents. These are commonly called the "one lungers," and are proving popular. They sell for \$800, and the agents declare that they can not supply the orders.

Because of the failure of the Indianapolis dealers to get cars from the factories, the French-Lick endurance run, which was scheduled for the latter part of this month, may be postponed. The exact date can not now be determined, but the dealers say that they intend to have the run and expect to make it elaborate.
