Hoosier Auto Race Site Surpasses the Briarcliff and Fares Well With Others.

## REFUSE TO SUPPORT TEST

Members of A. A. Contest Committee Withhold Sanction on New York-Seattle Run.

That the circuit proposed as a course for the stock chassis race for the Cobe trophy, which is to be run at Crownpoint, Ind., the latter part of May, is superior to Briarcliff and equal to the Vanderbilt course is the conclusion of the local auto fans. The committee of Chicago devotees which has been in this city in the interests of this race has imbedded enthusiasm in all who are interested in automobile events, and also instilled facts as to the value of the northern Hoosier track.

The circuit is twenty-three miles long. There are two straight ways, one of about ten miles which will permit cars to attain to the maximum speed of which they are capable. On the other legs of the course serpentine twists are sufficiently in evidence to test the mettle of the most skillful drivers. The highway at practically all points is wide enough for two cars to pass each other, and when the course of road improvement which N. H. Van Sickle has in mind is completed it is believed the surface will meet the most exacting requirements of the speed merchants.

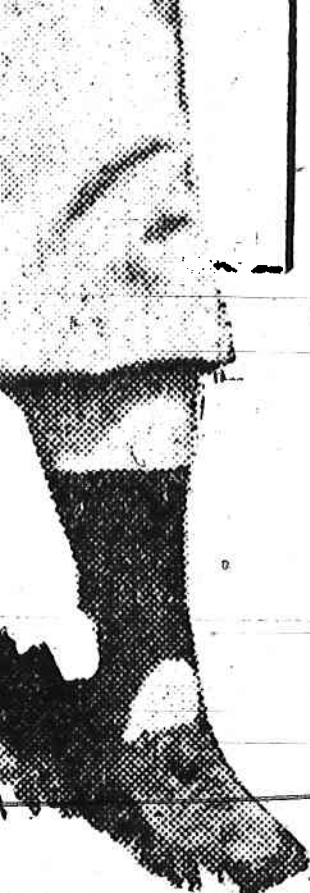

"Asininity has marked the first real session of the leaders of the new Manufacturers' Contest Association in New York last night. The association adopted resolutions in which it was decided not to lend the support of the M. C. A. to the New York-Seattle automobile race, which is to be held in connection with the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition in Seattle.

"According to the official report from the meeting received here today the objection raised by the manufacturers is based on the fact that the entry blanks characterize the contest as a 'race,' thereby encouraging a violation of the various speed restricting regulations in force in a majority of the states to be traversed by the contestants.

"The manufacturers must have an ulterior purpose in opposing the contest for which a \$2,000 trophy has been given. They also must be blind or they would read further in the conditions of the contest and see that the contestants are not to exceed the speed limits in any state.

"It is not a race in the sense of a Vanderbilt Cup event; it is not a whit different from the Glidden tour, which at times takes on the aspect of a road race, the official car being required to keep down the pace. There is not the slightest doubt that the Pacific coast exposition people will get enough nominations for the contest to make it a big thing.
