# AUTOMOBILE RACES ATTRACT FIELDS

Ten Entries Each Already In for Cobe Cup and Indiana
Trophy.

#### LOWELL RACE NOT TO HURT

Conflicting Dates Will in No Measure Mar Events

Scheduled June 18-19.

Application made by the Lowell Automobile Club of Lowell, Mass., for the mational stock chassis race, which it is proposed to run in June, has not alarmed the promoters of the two Chicago Automobile Club events, the Cobe Cup and the Indiana Trophy, which are to be raced for June 18 and 19.

Chicago has the jump on the Easterners in that the club's organization is already perfected, the course secured, military protection promised, and enough entries already assured to make both races successes. Promoting a road race isn't accomplished in a week or so, and Chicago being so far advanced it is felt that Lowell will make little impression on the Indiana meet.

At the present time Frank H. Trego, general executive in charge of the paces, can count at least ten cars for each of the events, made up of representative American cars.
