LYTLE AGREES TO RACE WITH STRANG AND DEPALMA

**Toledo Driver, Convalescing From Typhoid
 Attack, Signs for Daytona
 Beach Event.**

TOLEDO, O., Feb. 21.—Herbert Lytle, the
 famous Toledo auto racer, who has just re-
 covered from a fourteen weeks' siege of
 typhoid fever, today closed negotiations with
 Senator M. J. Morgan of New York, promoter
 and manager of the Daytona automobile
 races, to enter the special invitation event
 arranged for himself, Ralph Depalma and
 Lewis Strang at the Daytona Beach meet
 March 23-26.

Robertson and Strang share honors with
 the Toledo man as the record road racers of
 the world for 1908. Depalma holds the
 track championship. They will race for a
 \$1,000 purse and extras. Lytle gave Mor-
 gan his assurance that he would enter the
 race if a car could be found, and Morgan
 said he could procure a Benz machine for
 Lytle. The Benz is a German car and fin-
 ished second in the Savannah grand prize.
 Lytle believes he can win.

CALIFORNIA HORSE OWNERS DESPERATE TO WIN FIRST

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 21.—There is
 a desperate race among the owners here to
 carry off first place in the various races,

 sixty-day period in which to plant some-

 go remains to be seen, as the proposed Mex-
 ican tracks across the border can not pos-
 sibly be built in time to give them a showing
 there.
