BREAKS WORLD'S AUTO RECORD FOR 25 MILES

De Palma Smashes Mark Made by Oldfield by Going Distance in 23:35.

READVILLE, Mass., June 17.—Averaging
56 3-5 seconds for each of twenty-five cir-
cuits of the one-mile Readville track today,
Ralph de Palma, driving a sixty-horse-power
Flat car, set up a new world's record for
twenty-five miles, the finish flag being
dropped 23 minutes and 35 seconds after it
had been waved for the start. De Palma's
new record displaces the mark of 23 minutes
38 3-5 seconds made by Barney Oldfield at
Fresno, Cal., Dec. 13, 1904. In a previous
attempt to break the world's mile record,
De Palma negotiated the circuit in 54 sec-
onds on the second trial, equalling the Read-
ville track record, but three seconds behind
the world's mark. The events were part of
the annual Bunker Hill day race meeting of
the Bay State Automobile Association, and
eight races were run off.
