## BREAKS WORLD'S AUTO RECORD FOR 25 MILES

De Palma Smashes Mark Made by Oldefield by Going Distance in 23:35.

READVILLE, Mass., June 17.—Averaging 56 3-5 seconds for each of twenty-five circuits of the one-mile Readville track today. Ralph de Palma, driving a sixty-horse-power Fiat car, set up a new world's record for twenty-five miles, the finish flag being dropped 23 minutes and 35 seconds after it had been waved for the start. De Palma's new record displaces the mark of 23 minutes 38 3-5 seconds made by Barney Oldfiel at Fresno, Cal., Dec. 13, 1904. In a previous attack to break the world's mile record. De Palma negotiated the circuit in 54 seconds on the second trial, equaling the Readville track record, but three seconds behind the world's mark. The events were part of the Bay State Automobile Association, and eight races were run off.
