DE PALMA BREAKS RECORDS.

**Smashes Three World's Auto Marks on
 St. Paul Fair Grounds Track.**

ST. PAUL, Minn., Sept. 11.—Ralph De
 Palma, in his 90-horse-power Fiat Cyclone,
 broke three world's records at the State Fair
 track this afternoon. All the records were
 for a circular track. In the one-mile race
 with Kilpatrick, who drove a Hotchkiss, De
 Palma lowered his own record, made on the
 state track last year. He went the distance
 in :50 4-5, the time last year being :51 flat.
 De Palma lowered the three-mile record
 twice during the afternoon. In the match
 race with Kilpatrick he went the distance
 in 2:38. The former record was 2:43. Not
 satisfied with this performance, De Palma
 went into the ten-mile race and made it in
 8:49 3-5.
