GET \$1,000 IN GOLD.

PRIZE FOR REDUCED RECORD

The complete program for the Memorial day auto races at the State Fair grounds has been issued, including eight events. The trial against time of Barney Oldfield, who will arrive in the city tomorrow from Cincinnati, will be the feature. The entire program follows:

Event No. 1—Indianapolis Endurance Derby, 100 miles; open to fully-equipped touring cars; lamps and fenders may be striped.

Event No. 2—Three miles, open to motorcycles. Event may be declared a handicap in judgment of referee.

Event No. 3—Three miles, open to cars listing less than \$1,000; catalogue equipment.

Event No. 4—Three miles, open to cars listing \$1,000 and less than \$2,000; catalogue equipment.

Event No. 5—Three miles, novelty race, open to fully-equipped touring cars, carrying three passengers and driver. At pistol engines are to be started, driver and passengers are to mount to their places. At end of first mile cars are to come to full stop and passengers discharged. At end of second mile cars are to come to full stop and passengers to be picked up. Last mile to be flying finish.

Event No. 6—Five miles, open to fully-equipped cars listing \$2,000 and over.

Event No. 7—The great Hoosier State sweepstakes, open to the world; prize, \$1,000 in gold coin; \$500 to be added if world's competition record is broken. (Barney Oldfield is entered in this event.)

Event No. 6—Five miles, open to fully-equipped cars listing \$2,000 and over.

Event No. 7—The great Hoosier State sweepstakes, open to the world; prize, \$1,000 in gold coin; \$500 to be added if world's competition record is broken. (Barney Oldfield is entered in this event.)

Event No. 8—Record trials, open to racing cars, against the world's circular-track record of fifty-three seconds, held by Barney Oldfield. Barney Oldfield will drive against his record, using his famous Peerless Green Dragon, with which he holds all world circular-track records from one to fifty miles. Prize, \$500 in gold coin if record is broken.

—Conditions of Entry.—

Fully equipped cars must be proved in accordance with catalogue equipment if demanded by other contestants. Three starters will be required in all races. Entries close with the racing secretary on Tuesday, May 28, at noon. Entrance fee for each event, \$2. Motorcycle event, 50 cents. Three tickets and track badges will be given each entrant in automobile races, and one ticket in the motorcycle event. These tickets will be distributed at Fisher's, on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning.
