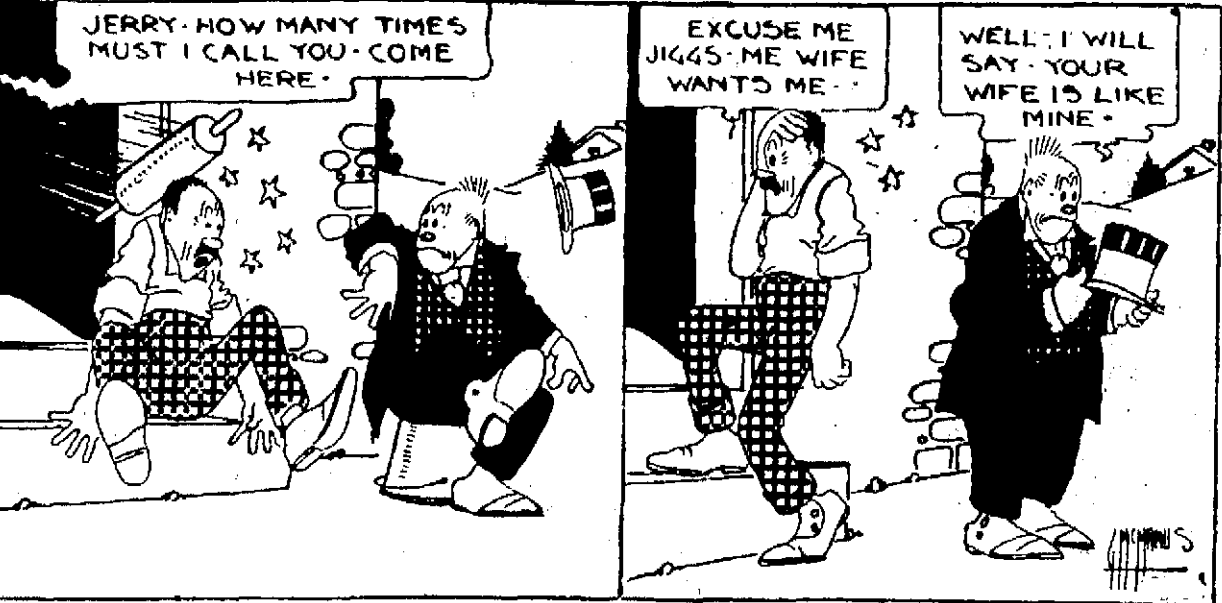

INDIANAPOLIS TO SEE GOUX RACE

Famous Speeder Won 500-Mile Race in 1915; Has Been Fighting in French Army.

Indianapolis, Ind., March 6.—Jules Goux, winner of the 1913 500-mile race on the Indianapolis speedway, will come to America in April to drive a Peugeot car in the 500-mile Liberty sweepstakes, May 21, on the Hoosier oval. Goux was the first foreigner to win a European speed creation to America and win the greatest of track races. He came back again in 1914, but fire luck relegated him to fourth place.

When Goux comes over to drive the Peugeot that the late Johnny Aitken tooped to second place in the 1916 championship of the American Automobile association, he will have a particular interest in Aitken's car for Johnny made him a winner in 1913 when the kind-hearted Irishman took charge of the team for Goux and the late Paul Zuccarelli mapped out the race and managed the pits during the race. Also, when war was declared in 1914, Aitken was in Paris as the guest of Goux. Goux was undecided about coming to America to compete in the race until he was offered Aitken's car. He is now ready and willing to come to settle Johnny's score with Darío Resta.

Goux went thru the entire war with the armies of France in an engineers' regiment. In the war he was his team mate, the late Georges Boillot, who came over in 1914 to help Goux train Rene Thomas and the DeLage, but failed when he broke a frame after forcing the pace on the rest of the field for 350 miles, and for his last 100 miles oscillating between second and third place.

Many of the racing fans of France expected Goux to take Andre Boillot, a brother of Georges, for a speed mate this season. However, the Peugeot factory is not ready to put a team in the field this year, but it is probable that when they send over their latest creation, next year, Andre will be sharing the Peugeot honors with Goux.
