

NAVY ADOPTS NOVEL IDEA

Sends Converted Yacht Wasp Up Hudson River to Lure Youths Into Service.

Washington, Nov. 30.—With decreases increasing in the army and navy and enlistments falling off, the two branches of the United States service have been compelled to look elsewhere for strength. The prospect of going on the Pacific cruise has been a strong argument with the enlisted officers, and the naval authorities are under fire in persuading young men to enter. In recent years the methods of the two departments have changed radically.

One of the first acts of the new administration was to issue a general order to the post offices and other public places offering the opportunity to enlist. Today the department gets out illustrated booklets to the people of the country containing pictures in colors showing the delights of life afloat and the pleasures of travel ashore. 



LAWYER PLANS WAR ON PROHIBITION LAW

Indiana Attorney Employed to Fight Clause in Constitution of New State.

LEGAL BATTLE IS PROMISED

Both Sides Ready to Fight for Supremacy in Oklahoma Struggle.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Ind., Nov. 30.—That a united effort will be made by some of the prominent attorneys of Oklahoma, the new state recently admitted to the Union, to enjoin the attorney general and the state commissioners of elections, entering the prohibition clause of the state's Constitution, is now an assured fact.

Col. Lee F. Wilson, formerly an attorney of this city, who went to Colorado and became a lawyer there, has agreed to take charge of the fight by the anti-prohibitionists of the state. Mr. Wilson will receive as his fee \$15,000, 10 per cent of which will go to the attorney general, whose bank in credit. He will be assisted by another attorney from this state, among whom is his brother, H. G. Wilson, formerly of Denver, Colo.
