for which he was noted to a Lieutenant.  
He returned to Vincennes during the war  
and organized Company I of the Eightieth  
Indiana Volunteer Infantry, of which he  
became captain. He was wounded at the  
battle of Perryville and lost the hearing  
of one ear by the shattering of the ear-  
drum.

At the conclusion of the war he returned  
to Vincennes and engaged in business as  
a merchant. He was one of the organizers  
of the Jeff C. Davis Post, G. A. R., and  
was its commander for ten years. He  
took an active interest in politics and  
was chairman of the Republican county  
committee for several years. He was  
postmaster of Vincennes under President  
Garfield's administration.

He moved to Indianapolis in 1897 and  
became a patent promoter. He backed  
several successful inventions, among them  
an instantaneous ice cream freezer which  
has been sold all over the United States.
