STODDARD IS VICTOR

BEATS POPE-TOLEDO EASILY

CHARLES MERZ DRIVES FISHER'S
SPEEDY AUTOMOBILE AROUND THE
FAIR GROUNDS TRACK IN FAST
TIME AND WINS SIDE BET.

Carl Fisher's Stoddard-Dayton ma-
chine, driven by Charles Merz, had little
difficulty in defeating the Pope-Toledo car
in their match race at the Fair Grounds
yesterday afternoon. The Stoddard fair-
ly ate up the ten miles and finished over
a mile to the good on its opponent. The
time was 13 minutes flat.

Fisher had staked \$1,000 on his car
against an equal amount put up by the
Pope-Toledo company, and he never had
any occasion to worry about the result.
Merz again proved himself one of the best
young drivers in the city, for he piloted
his touring car around the curves like a
veteran.

A few days ago Merz guided the Stod-
dard to victory over a Haynes car in a
match race at the Fair Grounds. The Pope-
Toledo was not held cheaply, however,
and Charley let the Stoddard out, but it

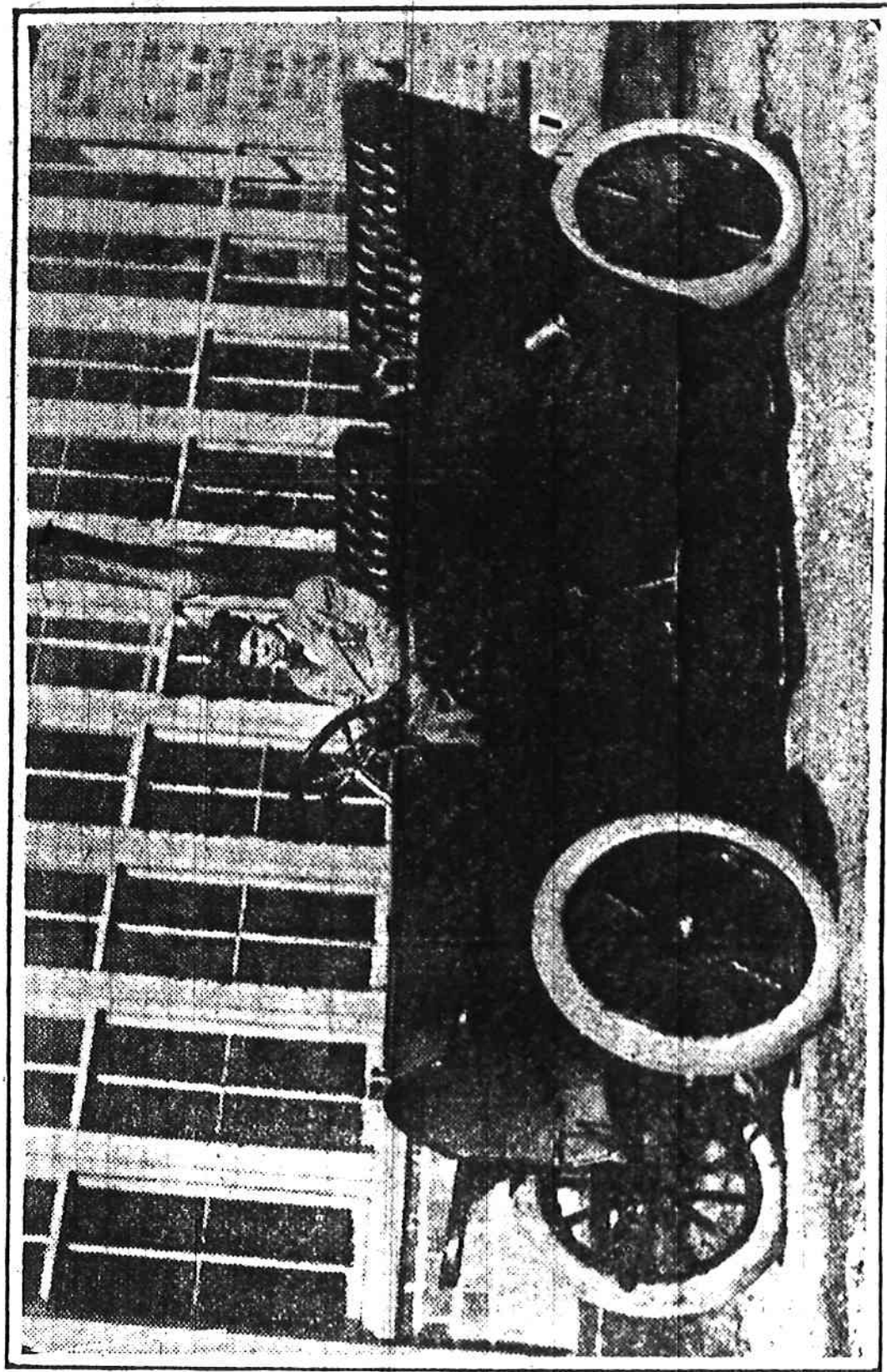

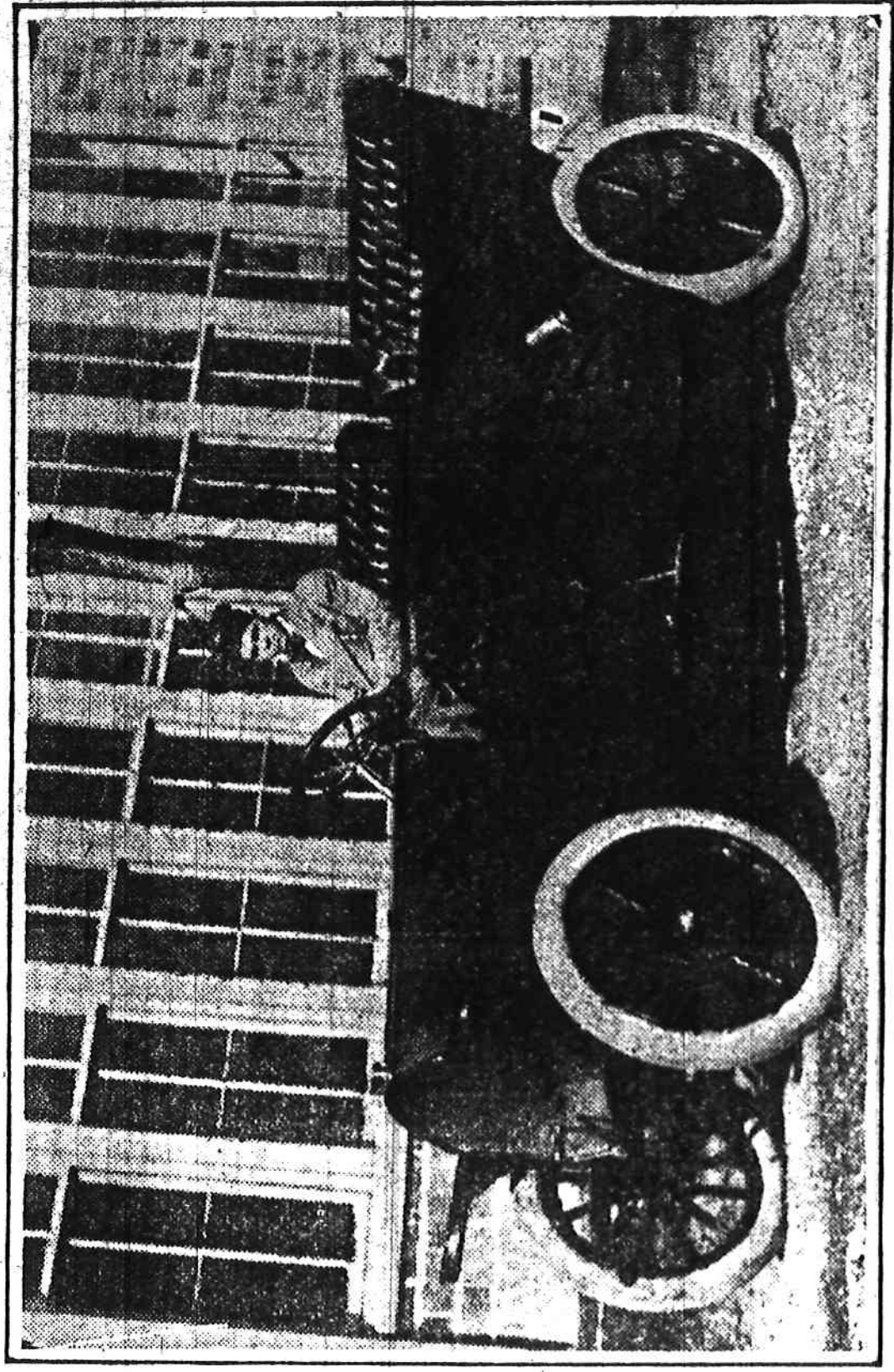
