The car is of the open body type, but is especially suitable for touring in winter. In addition to its thorough equipment all the usual appliances for keeping warm were carried. Mr. Fisher did not expect any delay on account of snowdrifts that might be encountered in northern Indiana and was confident of making the trip on schedule time. He also expected to drive his car through to Indianapolis on the return trip. The trip is probably the longest ever attempted by an Indianapolis motorist under the existing conditions.
