

ANCE FISH LAWS UNIQUE CHART

Closed Seasons on All
and Game Shown by
Black and White.

WHEN SHOULD KNOW

Doner Sweeney Praised

Game Commissioner Z. T.
issued a chart which every
angler in the State should be
acquainted with, as it is a
detailed explanation of the fishing and
game laws of the State. The knowl-
edge of the recent
enactments of the recent
legislation for the protection of the
game is all the more valuable
because the rules are being
enforced and the transgressor is
heavily fined regardless of
whether the misdemeanor is intentional
or ignorance.

It is absolutely forbidden any one to
hunt for turkey, pheasant and wild
game during the year. The
open season on quail, grouse, prairie
chickens is only fifty days long, begin-
ning on May 10 and closing the end of
June. During the short open period
the limit for quail is fifteen in one
day.

The chart shows that the open season
on duck, geese, brant or other
waterfowl is of seven months duration,
beginning in January, February, March and
April, and ending in October, November and De-
cember. The limit on these fowl is fifteen
in one day. It is also against the law to
hunt for duck at any time.

It is the least protected of
game animals hunted by the sports-
men. The open season on "bunny" lasts
ten days, October and the first ten
days of November.

The open season on squirrels lasts
ten months of July, August and
September. The laws allow the shooting
of squirrels during the last half of the
year.

For killing deer, turkey
and other game the fine is \$50. For hunting
game in the State the most in-
sistent of the laws.
