ENDURANCE RUN AND HILL CLIMB SUCCESS

Charles Gardner, in a Marmon car, won the French Lick endurance run Saturday, covering the distance in 1:14 minutes of the schedule arranged by Thomas Taggart, which was sealed and unknown to the contestants. Fifteen cars took part in the contest and all finished within thirty minutes of the time scheduled.

The big feature of the run was the hill climb at French Lick that was won by Thomas Kincaid. He ran his \$2,500 National car up the 1,485-foot hill in 30 seconds flat. Carl Fisher drove a National up the hill in 31 4-5 seconds. Frank Moore won the second event in a \$2,000 roadster in 40 4-5 seconds. H. L. Martz won the event for small cars, climbing the hill in 46 1-5 seconds in a Maxwell \$900 car. The steep hill was lined with people and much interest was shown in the event.

The winner of the endurance run received a silver trophy donated by Carl Fisher, and the hill climb winner was rewarded with a silver trophy donated by Thomas Taggart. The distance was 132.6 miles and the scheduled time was 6:47:28. The return trip was a go-as-you-please affair, the autolists taking any route they desired. Rain marred the return yesterday.
