# READY FOR BIG RACE

## FRENCH AUTO EVENT TUESDAY

### Grand Prix Contest Promises to Be Hardest Fought and Fastest Struggle Yet Run.

DIEPPE, France, June 30.—Prepara- tions have been completed for the Grand Prix contest of the Automobile Club of France on Tuesday, which promises to be the hardest fought and fastest race yet run. The Madrid-Paris competition last year, when the cars were driven half the time through a surging sea of people, was the death blow to straight- away speed racing in France.

This year a beautiful closed triangular course, the angles being at Dieppe, Eu and Londinieres, one of which skirts the sea, has been selected. It measures seventy kilometers and must be cir- culated ten times. The roadway is in perfect condition, but has a few danger- ous turnings and many rapid curves. It is expected that Duray's record of speed over the Ardennes course will be broken.

The most elaborate arrangements will be made to prevent mobs from invading the track. Eight thousand soldiers will be stationed at forty-foot intervals along the course and no person within the inclosure will be allowed to cross till the race is finished.
