NAZZARO CLIPS BEST MARK 42 TO COMPI

Winner of the Grand Prix Automo- Attractive Fo bile Race Averages 70.6 gram Arran Miles Per Hour.

DIEPPE, France, July 2.-Felice Nazzaro, driving a Flat car, was cheered tumultuously this afternoon as he dashed across the finish line winner of the Grand Prix automobile race after having smashed the world's record. His average speed was 70.6 miles an hour.

Nazzaro displayed wonderful nerve and coolness throughout the entire run. His endurance was one of the remarkable features of a day of thrills.

Francois Szisz; a Frenchman, was second to Nazzaro, and Baras third. Lanchia's car broke down near the end.

Few Americans were on hand when the start was made. Chairman J. DeMont Thompson was among those who were on hand early and was busy entertaining a box party of American and English friends. A brisk wind had blown all night and gave the racers a dry track, not-withstanding yesterday's heavy rains. The morning broke clear and cold and all

Lanchla's Flat car was the first to start. He went off to the music of a military band, which then took a rest until the next starter was about to leave and word was passed that the first rider to complete the course was approaching. He proved to be Lanchia, who thus came back as he started, to music. He made very good time, too, reaching the Eu at 6:30 o'clock and doing the home stretch so well that he completed the tour in 41 minutes, 33 seconds, hardly four minutes after the last competitor had started.
