



# MISS VANDERBILT'S COUNT MUST GO TO POLICE COURT

## New York Magistrate Summons Him to Appear to Answer Charge of Caning Zealous Photographer.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—As an outcome of a caning he is alleged to have given a too zealous photographer trying to get a snapshot of himself and his bride-to-be, Count Lazzio Szechenyi, who is to marry Miss Gladys Vanderbilt on Monday of next week, was today served with a summons to appear in Police Court tomorrow afternoon to answer a charge of assault. Edmund T. Reilly, a professional photographer, is the complainant.

Magistrate Finn refused to issue a warrant in the case today, but instead gave Reilly a summons which the latter served in person as the count was leaving the Vanderbilt house late today.

Through his attorney, Morris Cuker, the count today authorized the statement that he meant no discourtesy to the American press, as he understood that the complainant was a newspaper photographer. The count added that he would obey the summons, but at the same time denied that he had struck Reilly.

# "LITTLE EGYPT" WAS HIS WIFE, BANKER DECLARES

## Applies for Letters of Administration for \$200,000 Estate of Dead Dancer of Seeley Dinner Fame.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—Fred Hamlin of the banking firm of Hamlin & Co. of East Bloomfield, N. Y., has applied for letters of administration for the estate of Catherine Devine, the "Little Egypt" of Seeley dinner fame, who died alone in her flat on West Thirty-seventh street two weeks ago. Mr. Hamlin asserts that he married the dancer nearly twelve years ago.

The relatives of the dancer will fight Hamlin's claim. The estate is estimated at \$200,000.

At the time of "Little Egypt's" death it was not generally supposed that she had left a fortune. An investigation, however, revealed the fact that she owned real estate not only in New York, but in Long Island, Canada and New Jersey. In addition she had several bank accounts and much valuable jewelry. She had been on the stage for more than twenty years, and her income after the Seeley dinner, it is said, averaged nearly \$1,000 a week.
