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FORTY CARS QUALIFY FOR HILL CLIMBING

BIG PARADE CALLED OFF, CAUSING DISAPPOINTMENT.

AUTOISTS FROM DISTANCE

The autoists are holding a convention this afternoon at Glens Valley hill, seven miles southwest of Indianapolis, on the Three Notch road.
