PORTLAND, Ore., July 10.—Eddie Pichas, manager of the Portland Beas, allowed three hits to the visiting team in a game at Longport today.

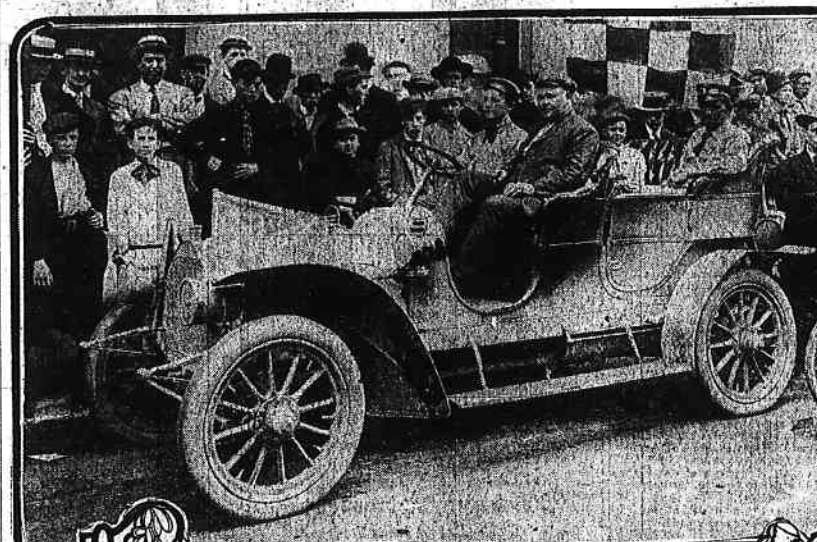
