One of the high-power cars caught fire but as water was handy no great damage was done. After a night in the special train with the cars parked within a short distance the journey to Kansas City by way of Oakley and Salina, Kas., was resumed this morning. The schedule today is eight hours for 165 miles to Oakley.
