NEWPORT, Ind., June 9. — Six thousand people witnessed the automobile hill-climb events given here yesterday under the auspices of the Danville Automobile Club. The races were hotly contested and interesting. There were five events.

Class A for runabouts was won by a Buick car, driven by Fred Calvert, of Rockville, Ind. Time, :36.

Class B was won by an Oakland car, driven by Boord, of Hoopeston, Ill. Time, :31.

Class C was also won by an Oakland car, driven by Boord, of Hoopeston, Ill. Time, :30½.

The free-for-all was won by Robert Kramer, of Attica in :25½. He afterward gave an exhibition when he covered the distance in :23. He drove a ninety-horse power Stearns. The hill is 2,300 feet long and 140 feet high. It has a grade of 14 per cent at the top.

The handsome cup donated by Uncle Joe Cannon, Speaker of the house of representatives, was won by "Reddy" McDonald, a high school boy of Danville, Ill. Time, :30. There were seventy-five entries in all the events.
