

# RACING GAME KILLED WHEN BILL PASSES

New York Legislative Body  
Passes Measure Which Will  
Stop Wagering in Any Form.

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1

ALBANY, N. Y., May 27.—The senate and assembly today put the screws finally on racetrack bookmaking, when the most important of the series of the Agnew-Perkins racetrack bills were passed and sent to Gov. Hughes.

In the senate Senator Agnew succeeded in having the senate rules suspended and the Perkins bill, repealing the section of the Percy-Gray law, which relieves from liability directors of racetracks which post signs prohibiting gambling, was passed by a vote of 28 yeas and 13 nays.

Later the assembly received the companion liability bill, which brings racetracks under the provisions of the anti-gambling law and carries out specifically the purposes of the Perkins bill, which has been amended in the senate. There were objections in concurring in these amendments and this bill was referred to the rules committee.

BUICK MARVELS OF SPEED

With the thunderous roar of a battery of artillery great speed monsters of blue, red, slate, yellow and varied colors are whirling around the big two-and-a-half mile brick auto track today in final practice for the championship races, which opens Friday. Record speed is being attained by many of the modern juggernauts, and every indication points to a series of races which will go down in history as memorable.

The marvel of the course is a new racing car of six cylinders, built for Johnny Aitken by the National company, a local factory. He is expected to carry off the honors of the free-for-all races. Aitken will drive this monster in three races tomorrow.

Barney Oldfield, the king of speed, intends driving the Knox in all events and is banking on being able to beat Aitken. His racing partner, Ben Kirscher, is here with the famous Barracq, with which he created such a sensation in Los Angeles.

Two new cars, which are sure to be marvels of the meet, are called Buick model 100. Louis Chevrolet, Cobe trophy winner, and Bobby Rutbam will handle these cars. More than 50 cars are entered in the races and all were out during the day for practice.
