MANY CARS WILL ENTER WHY BOADS
CONTEST FOR TROPHY

Prize Offered by Hower for Runabouts is Expected to Attract Record Number of Competitors.

Definite reports and statements made of intentions to enter a runabout for the Hower trophy contest, which is run in connection with the tour for the Glidden trophy, indicate that there will be more than twice as many competitors for this runabout prize next month as there were last summer. The Hower trophy will be competed for under the same rules as the Glidden trophy, with a point system of scoring and each runabout must carry an observer, the same as the touring cars. The runabouts will be divided into two
