#### **SPEEDWAY MANAGERS QUESTION**

#### **BROOKLAND'S BOOSTERS CONCERN- ING CONFUSED REPORTS ABOUT MARKS ON THAT COURSE.**

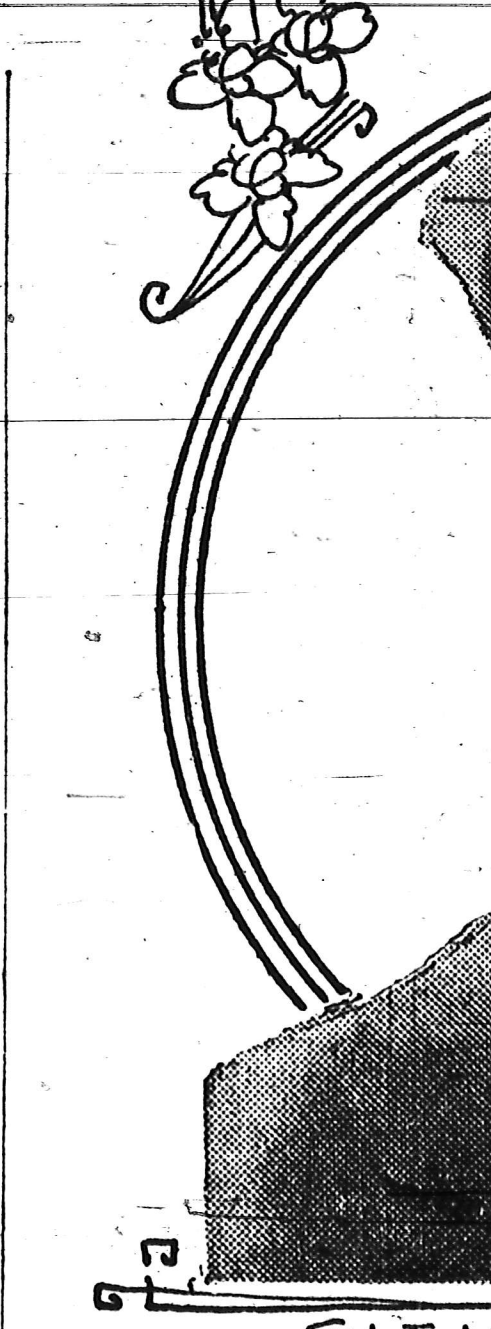
Much misinformation exists concerning the alleged records made at the famous Brooklands (England) Speedway. The managers of the local Speedway wrote to the race promoters in John Bull's country and received the following corrected list of records. The manager of the Brooklands said in reply to the query: "As regards records the Royal Automobile Club is, in this country, the arbiter of all world's records, and I think it would, therefore, be better for you to obtain definite reply from it to the points raised, and with this object I have forwarded a copy of your letter and this, my reply, to the Royal Automobile Club, and have arranged that you shall receive an official answer from it.

"We have, however, established in this country a series of 'Brooklands' records which are open for competition to cars in our four Brooklands standard classes. These classes are as follows: The 26 R. A. C. rating class, the 40 R. A. C. rating class, the 60 R. A. C. rating class, the 90 R. A. C. rating class. R. A. C. rating being calculated by the diameter of cylinders in inches and the number of cylinders.

"For these classes we have instituted long and short records; the long record being for ten laps of the Brooklands course from a standing start, and the short record, for a flying half mile. (The Brooklands lap 2.76687774 miles.)

"While on the subject of records it may interest you to know that the Royal Automobile Club will not recognize, or rather, will not put before the International commission for acceptance as 'world's records' any speeds in excess of sixty miles an hour unless the speeds have been electrically and automatically timed, as it is known that hand-timing at such speeds is liable to errors of very considerable extent.
