### COBE RACE SET FOR JULY 4

#### DISTANCE TO BE 200 MILES

**CHICAGO AUTO CLUB OFFICIAL MAKES FINAL ARRANGEMENTS WITH DIRECTOR MOROSS TO BRING MOTOR CLASSIC HERE.**

The classic Cobe Trophy race, pride of the Chicago Automobile Club, will be run over the course of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway July 4. This is the announcement that comes from E. A. Moross, director of contests at the Speedway, who yesterday completed arrangements with Chairman Genther of the contest board of the Chicago Club. The race is to be over a 200-mile distance for stock chassis cars of 600 cubic inches piston displacement or less, with a minimum weight of 2,300 pounds.

Interest in the great motoring event is not diminished for the Chicago enthusiasts by the removal of its location to the local course and plans are being made to run special trains from Chicago on the date of the race. The trophy will be placed on exhibition with others to be given at the Speedway course later in the month or early in June.

#### Trophy Is Rich Prize.

Director Moross started the quest for the Cobe race several weeks ago, and, while the fact that the event would be held here was certain, the details were not arranged until the conference in Chicago. The trophy is the gift of Ira M. Cobe of Chicago and is valued at \$5,000. It is now held by Chevrolet of the Buick Company.

Nearly every Indianapolis machine is eligible for this trophy, and it is believed by the Speedway officials that the local entry list will be large. The value of the trophy is great enough to coax many outside pilots to enter and the race bids fair to be one of the greatest the season will see.
