**WORLD'S CHAMPION AVIATOR
COMING TO INDIANAPOLIS.**

RUSHING NEW TRACK WORK

Glenn H. Curtiss, world's champion aviator, is coming to Indianapolis to make his headquarters at the motor speedway. He was expected to reach this city today from St. Louis, where he has been taking part in an aerial carnival. If the speedway comes up to his expectations, and its promoters are confident it will, Curtiss will move his flying machine factory to this city from Hammondspert.

At the speedway arrangements are being made for practice aeroplane flights. All telephone poles and other obstructions are being removed. It is the intention to make a big bid for the international aviation carnival next year and the speedway promoters are confident of landing that event.

Bricklayers at Work on Track.

The bricklayers are hard at work on the speedway, putting the course in condition for the speed trials scheduled for November 1.

The track is two and one-half miles around, fifty feet wide on the stretches and sixty feet wide at the turns. Three million one hundred thousand Culver blocks are required for the work. The
