SEATTLE, Wash., June 24.-Thundering down hill on the last seventy miles of its dash, the Ford entry No. 2 in the New York to Seattle automobile race yesterday reached the gate of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition, winning the contest after a drive of twenty-two days and fifty-five minutes. The mud-bespattered machine with B. W. Scott at the wheel checked in at 12:55:35 o'clock.

The racing machine was met at Renton, several miles southeast of Seattle, by local motor enthusiasts, and escorted through a lane of people that thronged the business streets. At the exposition grounds an immense crowd had assembled cheering and waving flags in creeting to the triumphant contestants Arrangements have been completed to dis-

play the car at the fair.

Scott will reap a golden harvest for his daring in putting the little runabout across the continent ahead of all his rivals. In addition to the Guggenneim trophy, which goes to the victor, there is a cash prize of \$2,000 for first place and \$1,500 for second. \$1,500 for second. Henry Ford, manufacturer of the car, has decided to whack Henry up between Scott and Frank Kulick who handled Ford No. 1, the money value of the trophy-\$2,000.

Transcontinental trips galore have been made in the past, but this race just ended is the first official attempt to establish a record from the Atlantic to the Pacific
