OFFER \$15,000 GOLD TROPHY

Manufacturers Plan to Hang Up Rich Prize for Three Meetings at Indianapolis

Now that the Speedway promoters have practically been assured the Cobe trophy race for the July meeting, E. A. Moross is planning to bring the Lowell trophy here also:

This race has always been held on the Massachusetts course on Labor day and, therefore, the Indiana promoters were unable to hold a meet on that data last year.

The Lowell promoters have forfeited the September date in favor of the Speedway this year and for that reason it is expected that the Indianapolis men will be able to bring the race to Indiana.

The Indianapolis Motor Speedway will be in the limelight this year, holding more events of international importance than any other course in the world. To make it worth the while of the speed demons and the manufacturers to enter their cars another new trophy is being planned that will eclipse anything ever given in the way of a cup.

This prize will be a \$15,000 gold cup given by the Remy Magneto Company of Anderson and if it is offered it will be

This prize will be a \$15,000 gold cup given by the Remy Magneto Company of Anderson and if it is offered it will be raced for three times during the coming season. It will be the first prize in the twenty-four-hour race Aug. 12 and 13 and first in the major events of the July and September meets.

Value of Prizes Increased.

Such a cup will stand without a peer a trophy, exceeding the value of the Wheeler-Schebler cup by \$4,000, as this prize cup is valued at \$10,000, and the donors lately added \$1,000 in cash, bring-

ing the value up to \$11,000.

#### Three Trophy Races.

famous Wheeler-Schebler silver trophy, for which the cars contested in the 300-mile race last year, will be the prize again this season during the May and September meetings; the Prest-O-Lite race will also be run in May and September, while the G and J cup will be one of the inducements offered the entries in the May event.

E. A. Moross, director of contests, and Carl G. Fisher, president of the Motor Speedway, will leave this morning for Dayton, O., to confer with the Wright brothers. It is the desire of the Speedway management that the Wrights bring over their machines within the next three weeks and make trial flights at the track preparatory to the auto races. After May 20 it will be impossible for the aviators to use the grounds, which will be given over to speed merchants for practice for the races of May 27, 28 and 30.

All the practice flights of the aeronauts will be made early in the morning and behind closed gates, according to the present plans of the management.
