NATIONAL "70" APPEARS

BIG-POWERED CAR IN RACES

INDIANAPOLIS FACTORY MAKES NEW
MODEL TO COMPETE IN EVENTS
WITH SPEED MAKERS RE-
GARDLESS OF CLASS.

Two new speed creations will make
their initial bow the opening day of the
Indianapolis Motor Speedway meet. They
are the National "sixty" and National
"seventy," which will be entered in all
of the free-for-all, handicap and time-
trial events during the meet and driven
by Aitken and Kincaid, respectively. Each
of these speed demons has six cylinders.
The larger are five by five and one-half
inches and the smaller five by five inches,
which puts them in a class with the high-
est powered cars in the meet. The speed
of the "seventy," from all indications,
will be limited only by the man at the
wheel.

The "sixty" will be driven in Event No.
18 for the Wheeler & Shebler trophy on
Saturday, May 27. During the three days
National cars will participate in twenty
events, not counting the amateur events,
which are not listed at present. Three
cars are entered in each event on the
program. They will go after the free-
for-all, stock chassis 301-450 class, stock
chassis 450-600 class, time trial and ama-
teur honors.
